The District may disclose the final results of disciplinary proceedings to a victim of an alleged perpetrator of a crime of violence or a non-forcible sex offense, regardless of the outcome. The District may also disclose to anyone, the final results of a disciplinary proceeding in which it concludes that a student violated District policy with respect to a crime of violence or non-forcible sex offense. The offenses that apply to this permissible disclosure are:

Arson;

Assault offenses:

Burglary;

Criminal homicide – manslaughter by negligence;

Criminal homicide – murder and non-negligent manslaughter;

Pestruction, damage, or vandalism of property;

ing or abduction;

result of the disciplinary proceeding with respect to the alleged the name of any other student, including a victim or sight to confidentiality.

Any report of willful homicide, recommitted on or off campus, that is recommitted or law of the purposes of notifying the institution or law of practicably possible, disclosed to the local law enforcements shall not identify the victim, unless the victim consents to being information of his/her right to have his/her personally identifying information to the local law enforcement agency.
