Assessment instruments and placement policies have serious implications for equity, since students of color are mure likely to be placed into nemedial courses, and students placed into nemediation are much less likely to reach their educational goals

Community colleges are prohibited from requiring students to take a perequisite course unless they are highly unlikely to succeed in a higher level course without it, pursuant to Section 55008 of Title 5 of the California Code of Regulations, but this policy is not followed impractice

Colleges are required to use multiple measures in determining course placement, pursuant to Section 55522 of Title 5 of the California Cock of Regulations, but Title 5 of the California Cock of Regulations does not provide crough guidance in the use of multiple measures to crouve that sturbants are not excluded from courses in which they can be successful.

Evidence suggests that when used as the primary criterion for placement, assessment tests tend to under place students; and, a student's high school performance is a much stronger predictor of success intransfer level courses than standard placement tests.

AB 705 authorizes the CCC Board of Governos to establish negatations governing the use of high school performance and other measures, instruments, and placement models to ensure college implementation meets the goals of this legislation
