In an effort to improve CA Dream Act Application completion rates, Mi CASA hosted three days of Dream Act Application Assistance in collaboration with the Hartnell College Financial Aid Office on February 28 through March 2, 2018. Students were able to "drop in" to the Mi CASA student center and receive personalized assistance in a welcoming and safe environment. Over 50 students completed their Dream Act Applications over the course of the three days.

Mi CASA continues to assist individuals with free DACA Renewal. Since January, more than 100 students have been able to successfully renew their DACA with our support.

Director of Special Programs, Bronwyn Moreno along with several Mi CASA students, participated in a Special Roundtable Discussion with Senator Kamala Harris's State Director at the Monterey County Board of Supervisors on Thursday, March 1, 2018. Mi CASA brought forth the concerns of the students regarding ICE enforcement, and lack of access to mental health services for undocumented individuals and low income families.

On Friday, March 2, 2018, Mi CASA hosted a special Cafecito meeting

with guest Dr. Hortencia Jimenez, to discuss the psychological impact of immigration enforcement and family preparedness. Many students are experiencing stress and fear about recent reports that ICE has actively been detaining individuals in Salinas.

This month, Mi CASA officially launched an internship program for undocumented students funded through the Packard Foundation. On Wednesday, March 7, team member Miriam Vazquez conducted a training and orientation for eight Mi CASA students who will be participating in the Dreamer Community Service Scholarship program.
