Mi CASA staff led a campus wide response to the rescission of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) Program which was announced by the Trump Administration on Tuesday September 5. Activities included: Statement of support from the Superintendent/President emailed to all Dreamer students; clarifying facts and details were emailed to all Dreamer students and Allies: comfort foods and open office hours were held in Mi CASA; two self-care workshops/talking circles were held. Future plans include emergency DACA renewal clinics and trainings to teach students how to become independent contractors

Mi CASA staff and students received DACA Application Preparation training from Maritza Correa of the UFW Foundation

Mi CASA, in collaboration with United Farm Workers Foundation and local attorney Magnolia Zarraga, implemented two free DACA Renewal Clinics for students whose DACA permits expire before March 5, 2018. The clinics were held on Friday, September 15, 2017 and Sunday, September 17, 2017 from 10:00 AM to 2:00 PM. Students were provided with onsite assistance accessing the Mission Asset fund scholarship to pay their renewal fees. At least 10 emergency renewals were completed.
