

Dr. Layheng Ting pointed out that the Skills Builder in Slide 12 (shown below), a report mandated by the Chancellor's Office, indicated a 3% outcome/advantage to increased income without being a full-time student. What attributed to the 3% change is unknown but a good sign.



Dr. Ting went on to say that the Joint Public Authority (JPA) compared Hartnell College to other colleges for the 1<sup>st</sup> time. There were 6 peers in a comparison group of 16.

I am writing to inform you about changes in the Hartnell College governance system that will be implemented at the start of the 2017-18 year as approved by the CPC at its 5/17/17 meeting, and as they impact both the CPC and IEC.

Key responsibilities of the IEC have now been incorporated into a streamlined set of responsibilities for the CPC, such that the CPC will become more fundamentally a planning council that will tackle the system of responsibilities from institutional purpose and goal-setting, to strategic planning, resource allocation, and institutional effectiveness.
