- Statistics (with & without 1-unit corequisite)
- Precalculus (with & without 1-unit corequisite)
- Trigonometry
- Calculus I (with & without support)
- Calculus for Managerial, Life and Social Sciences
- Number System
- Finite Mathematics

Dr. Yahdi demonstrated sample placements with the "Math Placement Guidelines" document posted on the council's website, and Ms. Garcia graciously participated from her own math background.

Mr. Anderson stated that the question may also be interpreted by students that they only have to see counselors in his department, as opposed to seeking assistance from a department such as the Transfer and Career Center.
