College Readiness

College Readiness met with North Monterey High School District on November 6, 2018 to discuss student progress in dual enrollment, Spring 2019 and 2019-2020 academic year dual enrollment offerings, as well as high school articulation options.

The College Readiness Director met with Monterey County Office of Education College and Career Readiness Administrator on November 6, 2018 to discuss opportunities to collaborate on College Readiness efforts across the Salinas Valley.

College Readiness hosted over 100 dual enrollment students and Hartnell Upward Bound students on November 7, 2018. Students received a tour of the campus, heard presentations on MiCASA, Salinas Valley Promise, EOPS/CalWORKs, MESA, the Teacher Preparation Program, as well as from Hartnell College students, and also were able to visit with various college representatives as this experience occurred on the same day as the Hartnell College Fair. Dual Enrollment students were also able to pick up their Hartnell College ID cards, a benefit of dual enrollment participation.

College Readiness Director presented to the Hartnell College Foundation Executive Committee on Wednesday, November 14, 2018 on the College Transition Summit and Dual Enrollment.

College Readiness Director along with VP Jalomo, VP Cruz, and CSUMB Administrators participated in the Bridging the Gap convening in Long Beach on November 15 & November 16, 2018. The convening allowed for a dialog within a community of practice with our Long Beach Community College

HEP Director attended the HEP/CAMP national conference from Nov 5-8th. HEP Bridge Fall program began. This program is a collaboration between HEP and Continuing Education program to provide pre-High School Equivalency instruction to prospective students needing intervention.
